Event attractions

History of Trinity House

Grade 1 listed Trinity House is one of London's most distinguished venues, with views of the Tower of London across the Trinity House Gardens.

Home to the General Lighthouse Authority, it houses a remarkable collection of maritime artefacts that showcase its historical role in the nation's maritime history.

Built between 1794-96 by Samuel Wyatt, Surveyor to the Corporation, and brother of the famous James, the foundation stone was laid by Prime Minister William Pitt the Younger on 12th September 1793, and the first Court was held inside the new building on 23rd May 1796.

In 1940, a German bomb gutted the building, leaving only the Trinity Square façade. Professor (later Sir) Albert E. Richardson reconstructed the house, using 1919 photographs from Country Life Magazine to recreate its original form. Trinity House was refurbished and redecorated in March 1990, with the redecoration in keeping with the 1790s period when the house was originally built.
