## Making a Difference

As I write this comment, I am a third of the way through my Master's year and I can't believe how quickly the last four months have gone.

My Installation at the end of October at Merchant Taylors' Hall was a truly memorable day. Our Livery was honoured with over 250 Liverymen, Freemen and guests who gathered to celebrate an important occasion of our Livery calendar. The special day included welcoming a record 13 new Liverymen.

Since that evening, I've had the privilege of attending very special events and ceremonies. To mention a few, the first was in November representing WCoBM at the Garden of Remembrance service at St Paul's Cathedral Churchyard. A time

to reflect and remember those who gave their lives for our freedom today and honour the courage and duty of those who serve in our armed forces.

Later in the month I visited the Old Bailey by kind invitation of the Sheriff & Deputy Keith Bottomley. It was a unique opportunity to meet His Majesty's Judges first hand and gain insight into the judicial work of the Central Criminal Court. It was also very interesting to learn about the Old Bailey's crime prevention programmes, which includes working with schools and young people to raise awareness of the dangers of knife crime and gang involvement.

2026 started with a special invite to the launch of The Mark Long Trust on the 10<sup>th</sup> January, a new charity set up to pay tribute to BBMF Squadron Leader Mark Long who was tragically killed in a Spitfire crash in 2024.

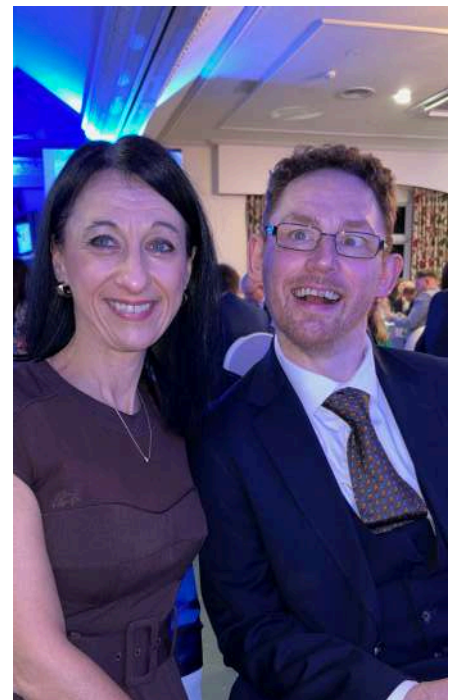
The BBMF is one of our Livery's military affiliations that we support through our charitable fund. The new Trust provides flying scholarships for people with disabilities to help build confidence through aviation experiences as Mark believed in the power of flight to inspire and uplift. In the Trust's own words, it aims to 'make the skies accessible to everyone'. Mike and I spent time with individuals benefitting from the work of the Trust, including Mark Morris who lives with cerebral palsy and became the first recipient of a Scholarship and to complete his flight training.

Philanthropy and making a difference to people's lives sits at the heart of the Livery movement and is close to my heart too. It's therefore such an honour to represent and lead WCoBM this year, encouraging positive change and embracing new opportunities while respecting core values and traditions that define and shape our City Livery Companies today.

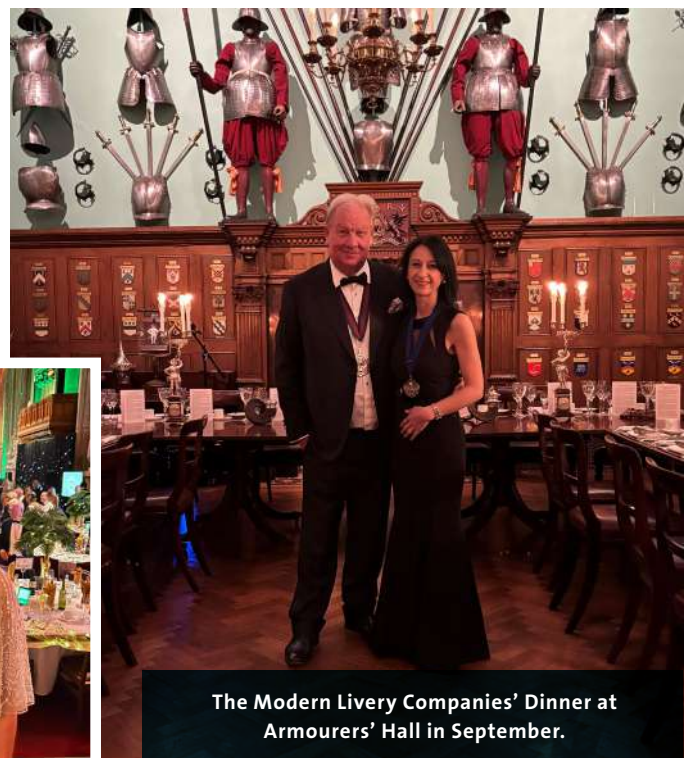

# Committee Update

## Making a difference every day

**Liveryman Steve Dunkley, Chair of the WCoBM Environmental, Social & Governance Committee, offers an update on the work of the committee and suggests ways you and your business can help make a difference to the environment.**

Did you know you can help improve the world's carbon emissions right from the comfort of your desk?

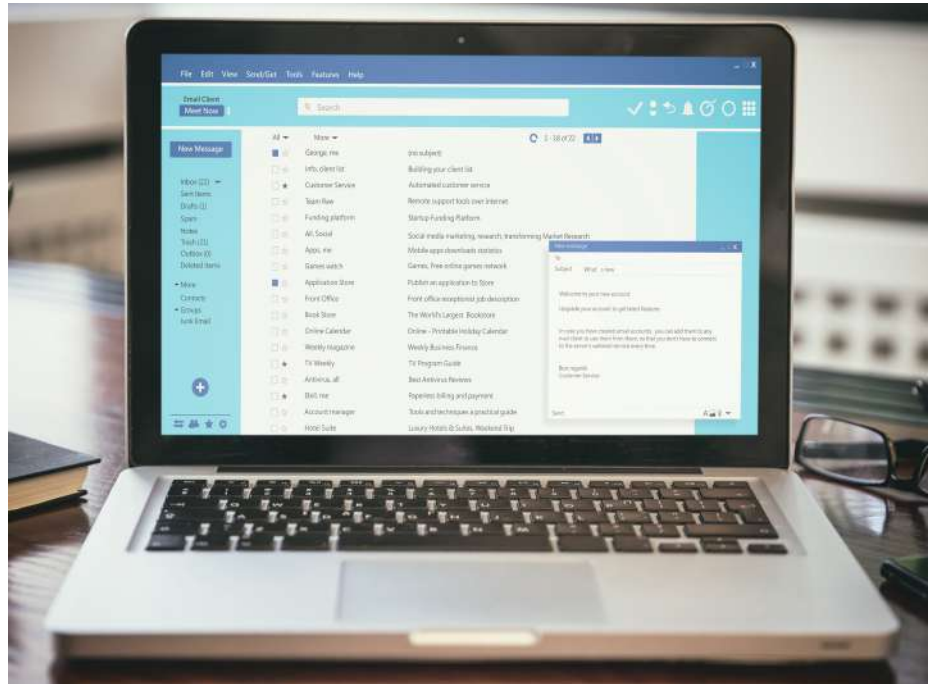
The Environmental, Social & Governance (ESG) committee attend many environmental events and webinars on behalf of the WCoBM, receiving data and information which could be interesting to our membership.

For example: University of Oxford researchers, working with the Carbon Literacy project, have calculated that through data centres:

- E-mails sent with a medium-sized attachment use 26g of CO<sub>2</sub>
- A regular 'text only' e-mail uses 4g of CO<sub>2</sub>
- Storing an old e-mail rather than deleting it once read uses 0.3g of CO<sub>2</sub> whenever it is filed or retrieved.

So, to reduce your carbon emissions, you could:

- Delete old e-mails and files (and especially photos) when they are no longer needed.
- Send e-mails without attachments and make documents available through a website or SharePoint server instead
- Make sure to only copy in those people who absolutely need to receive an email (carbon is used for every e-mail copy sent)
- Unsubscribe promptly from



any email services or marketing messages that you do not want to receive

- Encourage everyone in your business or organisation to do the same.

The actions you choose to take are your choice, but these simple steps offer real food for thought. These are easy ways that you could save carbon – and also save lots of time dealing with all those unwanted e-mails!

“**Professor Sir Tim Berners Lee, the man credited for inventing the worldwide web, recently said that he estimates e-mail alone contributes 150 million tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> to our global carbon emissions every year – and he knows a thing or two about computing!**”

WCOBM continues to be a strong supporter of Pollinating London Together (PLT), a charity that was founded by the Worshipful Companies of Wax Chandlers and Gardeners in 2020 with a mission to protect pollinators and promote biodiversity across the City of London. During PLT's Big Give Christmas Challenge between 2-9<sup>th</sup> December, every donation made to PLT through the Big Give Platform was doubled, generating vital funds to help transform London into a thriving city for Pollinators. By 9<sup>th</sup> December, the campaign had smashed its £20,000 target!

## Could our grants help someone you know build their career?
